The rule of the law	Year group: Topic covered within:	<p>KS4 Studies How U.K. laws, festivals and traditions are rooted in the Christian tradition. However, festivals, beliefs and cultures of other religious and non-religious traditions are also recognised and celebrated.</p> <p>Pupils will also look at the difference between crime and sin their relationship to morality, with reference to absolutist and relativistic approaches to the morality of actions. The different rationales given for criminal penalties: retribution, deterrence, rehabilitation and a critical evaluation of the justifiability of each, including Christian teachings about forgiveness.</p> <p>Arguments for and against Capital punishment within Christianity.</p>
Individual Liberty	Year group: Topic covered within:	<p>KS3 Studies Human Rights and aspects of Prejudice & Discrimination are taught throughout the KS3 course, with a dedicated unit to this work in Year 8.</p>
Mutual Respect	Year group: Topic covered within:	<p>KS3 Studies All year groups cover <i>mutual respect</i> when focusing on the life and teachings of Jesus Christ. Christian teachings are compared with the teachings of Hinduism, Sikhism, Buddhism & Islam across a variety of religious and moral issues.</p> <p>KS4 Studies Following the new GCSE specification enables learners to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● deepen their understanding of the relationship between people
